

Pocket Hugs

In this project, you will be creating small stuffed shapes to be used fidget tools. Fidget tools are self-regulation tools to help with focus, attention, calming, and active listening; they help students with tactile input, movement and sensory integration, and give students something to hold and play with without distracting them from the classroom environment.

While heart shapes are most common (and will be used as the sample in this document), other simple shapes like circles, squares and triangles are also acceptable. You will provide the materials to make the shapes – the fabric, thread, and stuffing. This project can be customized to your sewing skills; we've listed a few options below, but feel free to do your own thing!

Materials:

The best materials are bright colors, with a texture that the students can feel. Some examples:

- Felt
- Corduroy
- Fleece
- Velvet
- Velour
- Fake fur
- Waffle Cloth
- Minky
- Terry cloth

Please do not use wool, due to potential allergy concerns.

Pattern:

To keep the hearts pocket sized, the completed shape should be no larger than 2.5 inches in any direction. We've provided a few different patterns on the second page for reference. You may use your own heart shape, or another shape, as long as it is about the same size.



Instructions:

- Cut out two hearts using your chosen pattern and fabric.
- Place two pieces with back sides together.
- Blanket stitch (or whip stitch) around the edge, using embroidery thread or yarn. Be sure to leave an opening large enough to stuff the heart.
- Stuff with poly-fil.
- Sew the opening shut with the appropriate stitch.

Alternatives:

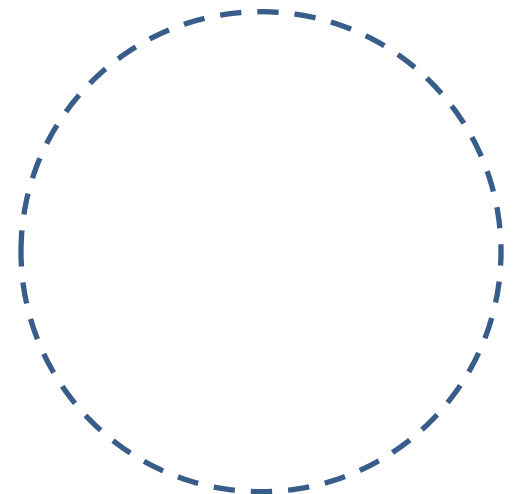
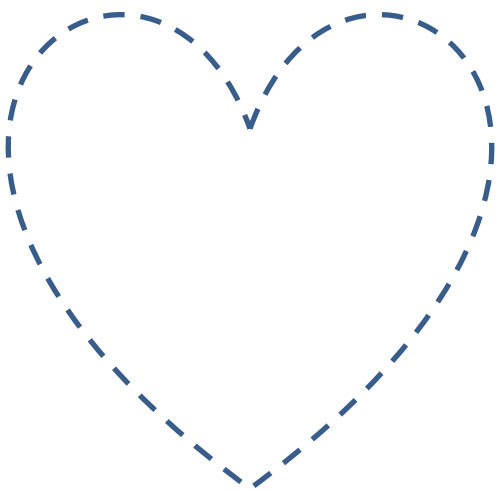
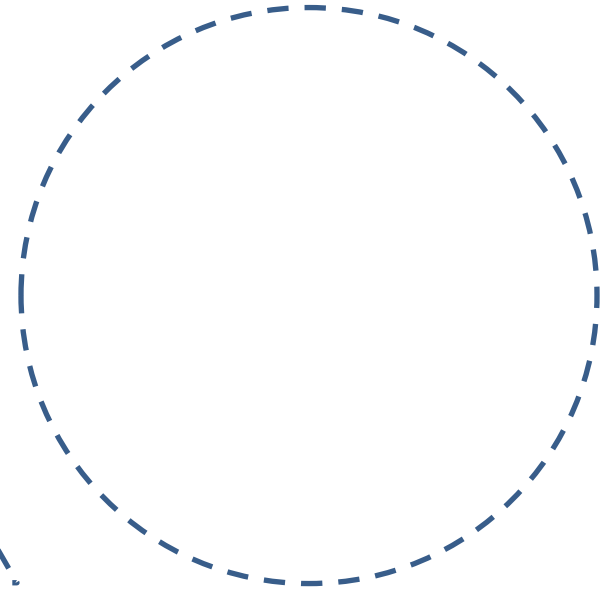
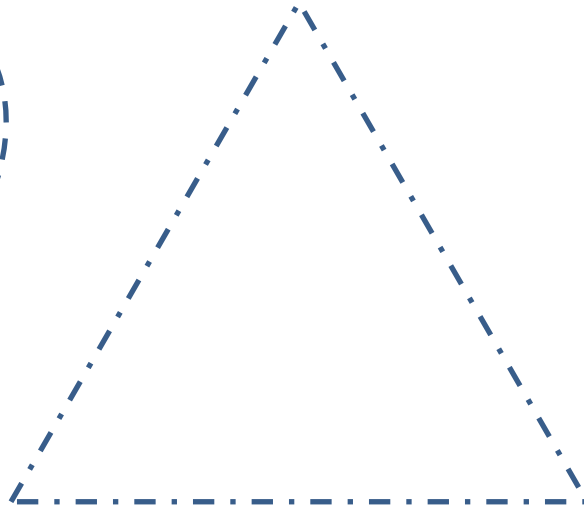
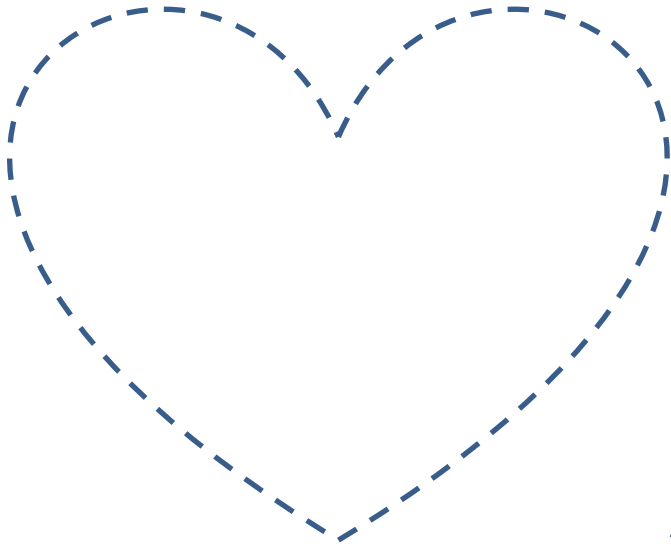
- Sew the hearts front sides together, leaving an opening. Clip the edges, turn the heart right side out, then stuff and sew the opening shut. This is especially useful for fabrics that tend to fray.
- Manually sew the hearts with a running stitch.
- Use pinking shears to cut around the sewn heart.
- Adding embroidered faces or designs to hearts is also ok. Please keep these designs very simple, and no beads or buttons, please.
- Use different colors or even fabrics on each side of the heart.

Packaging:

- Place all the completed hearts into a bag or box. Please label the container with the number of loose hearts it contains.
- Please print and fill out the Off-Site Kit form (the last page of this document) telling us who you are and what you created. Bring this with you when you deliver your donation.
- Deliver your completed project to Crayons to Classrooms any weekday between 9am and 4pm. Ring the bell at the employee entrance and a member of our staff will help you.

Sample Patterns:

- The larger sizes are for sewing right sides together and then turning right side out before stuffing.
- The smaller sizes are for blanket stitch or other options that don't require a $\frac{1}{4}$ inch allowance.
